Civil War and History in the Kansas Border Country

– A Kansas and Missouri (border) itinerary.

Civil War broke out on the Missouri-Kansas border a good seven years before it engulfed the rest of the nation. This is the experience of civil strife and history of the time along our state border from 1842 to 1865.

Battlefields and bunkers, many in amazing condition, still exist on both sides of the Missouri and Kansas line. History and hospitality thrive too, in Osawatomie, Pleasanton, Fort Scott, Kansas and Nevada, Missouri.

Kansas sites will be toured and interpreted by regional Border War historians. Along the route you will watch a movie about the Freedoms Frontier trail project, and an introductory film about Vernon County and Nevada, Missouri. Sites we will tour include Osawatomie (John Brown Museum and Adair Cabin), Pleasanton, (Battle of Mine Creek), Fort Scott - Lunch with Miss Pat at her gorgeous Lyons Twin Mansion, step-on tour of Fort Scott, then onto Nevada, Missouri where your group will visit the Bushwacker Museum, enjoy dessert, coffee and tea during a fashion show of men and women's clothing styles of the 1860's.
